### Nursery

Carol got us cutting and sticking to see if we could order animals by size - which proved trickier than we thought. Yasmin told us all about a bird's life cycle and how it is important to feed hungry mummy, daddy and fledgling birds at this time of year. The birds are all working so hard and growing fast. We couldn't resist doing a little bird spotting, too. Next week we will be putting on face masks and gloves to become dentists and learn a little about healthy eating.



### Class 1

Class 1 have had a busy first week back. We have had Forest School this week, building nests and feeding chicks. We have been looking at the physical features of the 7 continents and trying to make a map in under a minute! On Wednesday we went to Hereford Cathedral with Class 2 on a double-decker bus! We took part in four different activities and had lunch outside in the sunshine. We all enjoyed our tennis skills lesson on Thursday afternoon in PE. In Reception Maths we have been learning all about capacity and getting very wet! Today we have said goodbye to Miss Madeley, who has

finished her 7 week teacher training placement in Class 1. We wish her all the very best with the rest of her teaching degree. We will all miss her next week.



### Class 2

We all really enjoyed our visit to the Cathedral and will be using what we learned in our RE lesson over the coming weeks. In English we have been writing about the life of Mary Anning and explaining why she is famous. We have been using what we know about her in our maths lesson when solving word problems about fossils. We are now beginning to practise for our class Collective Worship which will be about the value Honesty.

### Class 3

Class 3 have had great fun this week being active and having some amazing new experiences. We had cricket coaching on Monday, played rounders on Tuesday and had an amazing time at Bell boating on Wednesday. The bell boating was a great end to the river part of this term's topic where we have also learned about estuaries and deltas and the wildlife that make these areas their homes. We have made pic collages to show what we have learned over the last few weeks. In English, we have started exploring the book Flotsam by David Weismann and have written some great descriptions about what we can see in the first few pages of the book. In maths, year 4 have been exploring acute and obtuse angles and Year 3 have been creating repeating patterns using quarter turns. We are very sad to say goodbye to Miss Richardson and wish her the very best for the future in



her training to become what we think will be a great teacher.

#### **Class 4**

This week Class 4 have learned about creating instruction texts and started to plan instructions for bell-boating. In Maths we have learned about equivalent fractions representing fractions in different ways and learned how to multiply fractions by whole numbers. In the afternoons, we have started our cricket session with a Worcestershire County Cricket coach, thought about how to escape a variety of deadly situations and started to program moving objects with Lego WeDo.



#### **Class 5**

This week, amidst all the sporting events we have attended, we have managed three really useful play rehearsals; we have already made great progress learning lines. On Tuesday most of us went to Eastnor Cricket Club for the inter-schools kwik cricket tournament, and then on Thursday to JMHS for a rounders tournament, these events sandwiched between a lovely day bell-boating on the Avon at Fladbury. Some of us really enjoyed supporting the children's learning in Class One and Nursery too. Today, we have begun a D&T project based around the Royal Game of Ur, an ancient boardgame we saw exhibited at the British Museum.
