## Book Sale



## Class 1

It's been a very quiet week in Class 1 as we have tried our best to be really, really quiet during lesson times in support of the SATS week for the older children. We've tackled written maths problems, instead of our usual hands-on, practical approach, and have been concentrating on our preparation for our Big Write in phonics at the start of next week. We have learned about being a Muslim in RE. Then on Wednesday we were able to make as much noise as we wanted as we ran through the woods at Storridge Farm! Earlier today we had one final practice for Sports Day, as well as a play on the adventure playground to finish off our physical week outdoors!

#### Class 2

This week we have been learning about owls and organising the information so that we can write a report. In maths we have been learning about 2- and

3-D shapes and have been thinking in particular about irregular shapes and comparing their properties. We held our last Forest School session this week in order to make way for Class 3 who will be starting their sessions after half term. The Forest School area is looking great at the moment, with mown paths through the trees, spring flowers and lots of places to play.

## Class 3

This week Class 3 have written descriptive shape poems and illustrated them for display. In maths we have been dividing using chunking and solving division puzzles and problems. We are creating a musical river journey and have made leaflets about the effects of pollution on our rivers. We have practised sports day and are hoping for good weather next week.











## Class 4

This week, the children in Class 4 have developed their knowledge of Kensuke's Kingdom through role-play and freeze-framing moments of the story. We then took photos and added these into a PicCollage on the iPads, discussing the emotions of the characters at each point. In Maths we have revised our knowledge of maths skills ready for our end-of-unit test. We have also thought about contrasting in Art, using rubbers to draw on charcoal. We have practised ready for Sports Day next week and developed our gymnastic skills. We have also looked forward to celebrating the Royal Wedding with afternoon tea outside with the rest of the school.
