Enjoy the weather while it lasts.





Pots and pans have been clattering in the mud kitchen as small groups of children have been busy creating mud pies and everyone has enjoyed splashing around in the water trays, using watering cans, funnels and bottles to collect and carry water, moving it from one tray to another.

On Tuesday, Katrina set up some art and craft activities for the children to enjoy. They were using various collage materials and lots of glitter to decorate a princess and some shiny paper, foil and silver paint to bring a knight to life. All of the children took part, sharing,taking it in turns, and working well together to finish off the characters. Kelley needed the children's help on Wednesday, to free the locked up dragons. They had to search for the correct key that fit the padlock, before unlocking it and setting the coloured dragons free. It was a very fiddly task, that involved some good fine motor skills and plenty of perseverance!!


Class 4 have been busy finding out about different aspects of ancient Egypt. They have been presenting their learning through some very impressive double-page spreads!




Would you like to volunteer in your local community?
