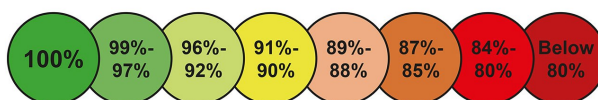

The school summer fair is always lots of fun, and in order to provide so many activities, we really need volunteers to help out. If you're able to, please contact Lucy, Cass or the office.

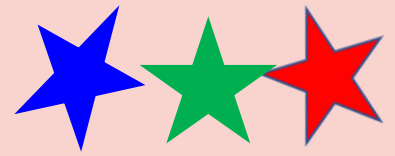
We're also very welcoming of any sponsorship to help fund the cost of the fair. If you're able to help personally, or through a business we'd be very grateful.

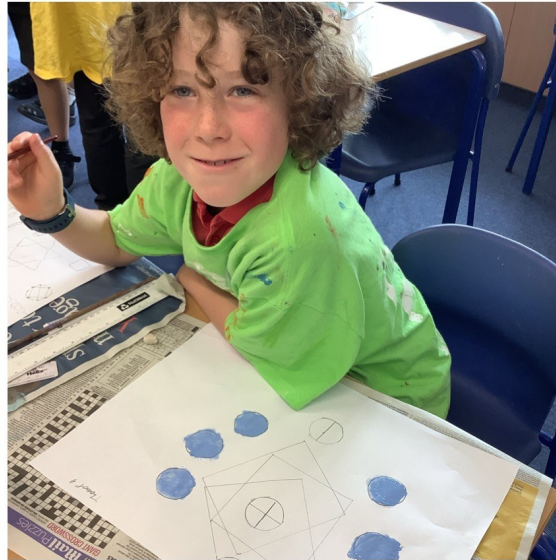
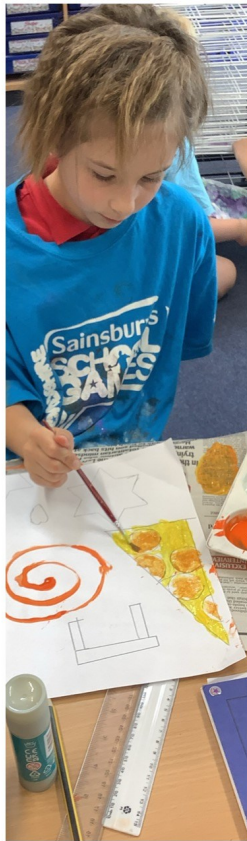
Maple Class

Class Three (Birch Class) working on their Islamic patterns in art.

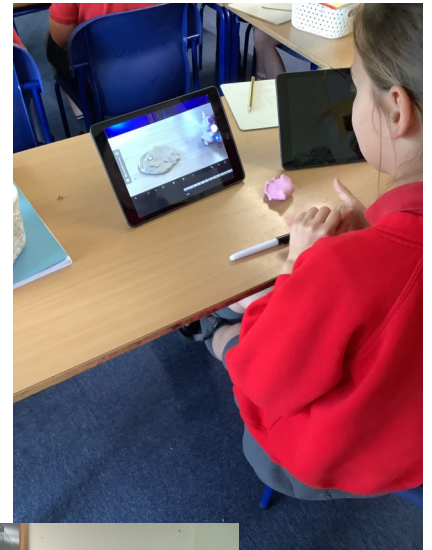
